An emotional day - the Tour of the Battlefields.

For those of us with Brit ex-squaddie blood still running through our blood – it was a very emotional experience – touring the Falklands battlefields. There are memorials to those who died liberating The Falklands, all over the place.

One (wind-swept bleak) place our mini-bus stopped at was one of the Argie defence positions – a machine gun sanger set-up – I couldn't figure out how on earth the Brits could even get close enough to take a shot never mind getting their boots (& blades) on the ground. The natural 'rock-fields' around the island are so horrendous I didn't even try to walk on them. The Brit squaddies (in darkness) carried 112 lbs on their backs over these rock fields to get into position for their attacks. (Helicopter cargo carriers had been destroyed).

Although I was trained in a recce regiment (cavalrymen ride to work) I do have some past experience of being a PBI. In the end, after all the 'other' arms have had their go, it still comes down to PBI boots & blades to winkle the enemy out of their positions. In the Falklands environment I guess the Argies made the ultimate mistake – Brit squaddies. Their basic Brit field craft was, as usual, magnificent.

Although Mother Nature is fixing man's stupidity – 30 years of filling the trenches with water – you still have to be careful not to walk on ground plants and then suddenly become neck deep in peat water!

Then there are the still vast areas of fenced in terrain – "Mines. Keep Out." As the tourist money comes in, the Falklands then hires 'de-miners' but it will take forever at this rate. And, on ground that could be producing food crops – that's the hard part to understand.

I just cannot understand. We can make better and better machines of war whose sole purpose is to kill. Yet, we still cannot resolve disputes with our neighbours. I hate war.

Just to add; we toured other areas of South America including some in Argentina on this trip. I must say the tourist guides & ordinary people we meet in Argentina were most respectful of The Falklands - when the subject came up. (They didn't know we had ex-pat Brits in our group). When naming the islands they did call them "The Falklands" and not "Las Malvinas" as had been done in the past. The feeling amongst them seems to be this was a **militarily political** fiasco and should never have happened. 'Twas ever thus!

"The Battlefields of the Falklands" was a very emotional day – as I said before. But, if I ever have the honour of touring the Afghanistan battlefields (where our Canadian boys & girls are still dying), I'm not sure I could handle it.

Lest we forget.
