Comrades, this month we are talking about homeless Veterans. Homeless Veterans are very much an issue that we as Canadians need to tackle. There are still too many of our brave Veterans without a place to live. The Royal Canadian Legion has many initiatives we are undertaking to tackle this problem. Please read below and get informed.

Homeless Veterans

The Royal Canadian Legion is committed to helping Veterans and their families in need find homes. There are national and provincial programs that offer financial assistance and support for homeless Veterans and those at-risk of homelessness.

How we can help

Trained Legion Command Service Officers can assist with the following:



Finding suitable accommodation: Legion Provincial Commands work closely with Veterans Affairs Canada, shelters and community organizations to get Veterans off the street and into temporary and/or long term accommodations.

Financial assistance: Through the Poppy Fund, housing support is provided through financial assistance for items such as first and last month's rent, rental arrears and furnishings. In addition, Legion Branches and Commands across the country support numerous initiatives to help homeless and near homeless Veterans in their communities. From outreach programs, to working with local organizations

and first responders to identify and refer Veterans to the Legion, to supporting housing and food banks,

Legion members are the 'boots on the ground', helping homeless and near homeless Veterans get the support they need.

The Legion's "Leave the Streets Behind" Program

"Leave the Streets Behind" is the Legion's national homeless Veterans program that started out of Ontario Command. The program's mission is to reach out to homeless Veterans and those at-risk of homelessness and provide them with immediate financial assistance and support. It also connects them with the social and community services to establish a long term solution to meet their needs.

While the "Leave the Streets Behind" program is operating in Ontario, British Columbia/Yukon, Alberta/North West Territories, Saskatchewan, Nova Scotia/Nunavut and New Brunswick Commands, supports and services through the Legion are available for homeless and near-homeless Veterans and their families across the country.

Partnering to support Veterans

The circumstances that can lead to homelessness can involve many issues, from mental illness, to financial challenges, to family circumstances, to failures with the system, and much more. In the Veteran community, homelessness can impact not only the Veteran, but their family as well.

The Legion is actively involved in advocating for supports and solutions for homeless Veterans. It was the Legion who hosted the first homeless Veterans Forum in 2014, bringing together industry experts, government representatives, Veterans organizations and community support services together for the first time. We continue to be fully involved in working to find solutions, coordinating the annual Legion's Veterans Homelessness Advisory Committee each year to help develop a coordinated approach across all stakeholders to address the issue.

The Legion works hard to get the word out to Veterans and their families about the help available. Our homeless Veterans program outreaches to shelters, first responders and organizations within communities to spread the word about our services and to coordinate supports for Veterans and their families in need. We also work with organizations such as [VETS Canada](#) and [Soldiers Helping Soldiers](#) to outreach to Veterans on the street. Once connected with a Veteran in need, we can provide immediate support and get them connected to the long-term supports and services they need.

Legion responds to Prime Minister's Comments at Edmonton Town Hall:

While there have been and always will be financial considerations, we firmly believe that meeting our Veterans' needs is fundamental to our foundation and freedom.

In a Town Hall recently in Edmonton, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau angered many in the Veteran community when he responded that the Canadian government is still fighting 'certain Veterans groups' in court because "they are asking for more than we are able to give right now."

These sorts of words are extremely insensitive to Canada's Veterans and reinforce a message that the government does not have an obligation to take care of Canada's ill and injured Veterans - and that Canada cannot afford it. Why then, do we continue to send our forces into harm's way if we are not willing to - or cannot - help them adequately upon return? This is inexcusable.

In the Town Hall, the Prime Minister said the revised New Veterans Charter – or Pension for Life plan - goes beyond what was offered in the Pension Act, and offers services, rehabilitation and supports to improve quality of life for the Veteran and their families and caregivers. He also clarified that the government "cannot return to the amount of money that was given before (through the Pension Act) without accounting for the money invested (in the New Veterans Charter) in services for Veterans."

The government's plan for a tax-free pain and suffering award for Veterans is promising, but based on the limited details of the plan released to date, the Royal Canadian Legion strongly believes there are still areas for improvement. The plan must include definitive financial support, along with compensation in the form of services and benefits – which together would equal what was offered in the original Pension Act. In addition, the most seriously ill and injured Veterans who cannot generate a comparable income, must receive lifelong financial security.

The Royal Canadian Legion is hearing from Veterans who want and need better communication and direction in terms of what the future actually holds for them under this new plan. The Legion has long advocated for care, benefits and lifelong financial security for ill and injured Veterans. It is well past time for this government to be very clear with all Canadians about its plans to meet our Veterans' needs, permanently.

While there have been and always will be financial considerations, we firmly believe that meeting our Veterans' needs is fundamental to our foundation and freedom. When asked to risk their lives and futures, our Veterans do so without hesitation. In return for their sacrifices, we must support them without hesitation and not use money as the main excuse for gaps in their care and benefits.

We reiterate that the whole of government must, without reserve, reaffirm its social contract and honour its obligation to provide for the men and women who are injured in the service of Canada.

The book publisher, Fenety Marketing, is currently conducting a Telephone Appeal on our behalf to private citizens and the business community throughout the Province of Ontario.

The funds raised through the program will assist and support many Legion initiatives and to assist Branches to remain a viable partner in their communities.
